On February 12th Fort Supply community members will have the opportunity to vote on two separate bond issues that will have an impact on the growth of our school and community if passed. After much thought from myself, the school board and community bond committee, we are submitting to you, two bonds that will meet the immediate and future needs of our students. **These bonds would be a “no projected tax increase” to the patrons of the district.** They will allow for safety and protection for our students, and will ensure that Fort Supply stays progressive in competing for prospective students and families who may be deciding which school district in our area they wish to reside and raise their families. It thrills me to see some of our past students moving back into the community, with thoughts of their children attending our great school.

I applaud past administrators, board members and community members for having the insight to continually make upgrades to our school with the addition of the safe room and combing the elementary and high school under one roof. However, the security system, transportation and general upkeep of facilities needs to be projects for us to improve.

The two bond issues will be:

Proposition #1 (\$525,000)

- To acquire route suburbans and an agriculture pickup
- To perform general maintenance District wide
- To acquire textbooks, technology equipment and other educational materials
- To acquire and/or install playground equipment and perform playground site improvements
- To acquire and/or install security cameras and other safety equipment

Proposition #2 (\$225,000)

- To acquire buses for pupil transportation

The passage of this bond will not only impact us now it will have a lasting impact for years to come. The safety of our children whether it is transportation or a security system will remain one of our highest priorities.
